## BILL

### No 68 of 1931.

#### An Act respecting Rights of Fishery.

### (Assented to , 1981.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, ensets as follows

1. This Act may be cited as "The Alberta Fishery Act."

2. This Act shall apply to all fishing and rights of fishing and all matters relating thereto which are within the legilative competence of the Frovince, and is subject to the exercise by the Painkament of Canada of its legislative jurisduction as to getcomst and minked fishing its.

3. The Landsenant Governor in Council may appoint a Director of Fishernes and such inspectors, fish wardens and other officels and servatils as may from time to turne be deemed expedient, and may prescribe their respective remuneration and duties.

4. The Legulenani Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations-

- (a) prohibiting any person from taking fish by any means whatoever from any lake, river, or stream to which the legislative guradiction of the Province extends, unless he is locensed personant to this Act as to do:
- (b) providing for the sisuance of locates permitting the holder thereof to take sish, which locates may be immided cithar as to the method of faining, or the waters from which fais may be taken, and the fees payable for any guth locates;
- (c) providing for incenses permitting the holder thereof to carry on a commercial fishery in any waters specified in such license;
- (d) establishing close seasons during which it shall be unlawful to take any fish or any specified variety of fish in all or any specified waters;
- (c) providing that, in respect of any specified kind of fish, it shall be unlawful to take more fish than is preserved as to sumber or weight, or both in any specified waters and during any specified period of time:

- (f) prescribing the manner in which any kind or kinds of failing shall be conducted and prohibiding my specified methods of fishing and the use of any specified apparatus, continuance or mode of failing;
- (g) providing for the segure and conflocation of any apparatus or contrivance for fishing which is used by any person in contravention of any legislaton made under this Act or by any person whilst fishing in contravention of this Act.
- (A) providing for the establishment of fish hatcheves and for their management and protection,
- (r) fixing the fees payable for any hornse secolding to the kind or class of locense and to the place of residence and to the occupation and other circumstances of the locense.
- (s) as to any other matter or thing relating or incidental to fisheries.

5.—(1) Any person who takes any fish or conducts any fighing operations in contravention of any regulation made pursuant to this Act shall be guilty of an offence.

2(2) If such offence is in respect of any regulation respecting commercial fiphing, such person shall be labble on summary conviction to a person shall be labble on armany conviction to a personal lot of the more than the value of a continueng offence, to a further penality of and more than fifty dollars a day for each day after the first day during which saids offence each immeas

(3) If such offence is an respect of any regulation other than a regulation respecting commercial fishing, such person shall be Hable upon summary conviction thereof to a penalty of not more than fifty dollars and outs

(4) The penalties provided by this section shall be in addition to any confiscation made pursuant to any regulation under this Act, of fishing apparatus and contrivences, and of fash ilegally takens

 Every inspector, figh warden or other officer appointed paragent to this Act may—
